

The Colton City Council met in regular session on Monday, May 10, 2010 at Colton City Hall. Mayor Erik Miller called the meeting to order at 8:05 PM with the following council members present for roll call: Jeffrey Pedersen and Ryan Tellberg. City personnel present were Gail DeJong, Mary Sterud and Ryan Fods.

DeJong administered the Oath of Office to Karen Burgers, Ward 1; Matthew Swartwout, Ward 2 and LeRoy Koopman, Ward 3.

Koopman made a motion to nominate Pedersen for Council President. Tellberg seconded. Koopman made a motion that nominations cease. Swartwout seconded the motion. The motions carried.

Koopman made a motion to nominate Burgers for Council Vice-President. Swartwout seconded the motion. Koopman made a motion that nominations cease. Swartwout seconded the motion. The motions carried.

Mayor Miller administered the Oath of Office to Gail DeJong and Ryan Fods.

Tellberg made a motion to approve the claims as presented in the amount of \$24,802.59. Burgers seconded the motion and it carried with all members present voting aye.

Pedersen made a motion to approve the 2010-2011 Package (off-sale) Malt Beverage application submitted by T&H Convenience Sales, Inc. dba Daybreak. Tellberg seconded the motion and it carried with all members present voting aye.

Collette Zeig from MidAmerican Energy presented the City with a check for \$200 to be used for the park. The City accepted and extended their thanks to Ms Zeig for the contribution.

Several members of the Jubilee Committee were present to review the various activities for Jubilee Days.

Arlys Moen and Jon Siegel requested that the City install a street sign at the corner of 6<sup>th</sup> Street and Ashland Avenue, that the streetlight be repaired and that

something be done concerning the condition of 6<sup>th</sup> Street. They requested that the City consider paving 6<sup>th</sup> Street and it was explained to them that all property owners abutting the street would have to agree and pay for the paving. Fods was instructed to install the street signs and DeJong would check on the street lighting.

Leona Kittelson requested that a street sign be installed at the corner of Glenn Avenue and Moonlight Drive, that a street light be installed on that corner and that the City put in a driveway approach to her property. It was explained that the driveway approach would be her responsibility and should have been installed by the developer. Fods was instructed to install a street sign and DeJong would check into installing a street light on that corner.

The meeting was at 9:31PM on a motion made by Pedersen and seconded by Swartwout.
